Rotunda A A, E, H, S	ADHD – It’s a Reason, Not an Excuse <i>Mrs. Lisa Joyner; Veritas Baptist College, Fredericksburg, VA</i> Everyone has an opinion about the under-diagnosis, over-diagnosis, or even the existence of ADHD. This workshop will explore what diagnosed kids and adults say about their own experiences with ADHD and will help teachers gain some understanding about how it really “feels” to struggle in school. We will discuss what research and the medical community say about ADHD, how it is diagnosed, new medications that doctors are prescribing, and some non-medication remedies.
Rotunda B UE	Nobody Likes a Boring Spelling Class <i>Dr. Chris Bowman; Pensacola Christian College, Pensacola, FL</i> Come find out about principles and methods that enable teachers and students to be successful in spelling.
Rotunda C A, H	A Biblical Approach to Dealing with Parents <i>Miss Jane Smith; Bob Jones University, Greenville, SC</i> This workshop discusses methods of dealing with parents about problems (particularly spiritual problems) in the lives of their children.
Rotunda D C, K	Building a Successful Phonics Lesson <i>Miss Charity Kerr; Pensacola Christian Academy, Pensacola, FL</i> Phonics provides the tools that students need to be good readers. Ideas will be given for the blueprint, the tools needed, and the mortar (transitions, games, songs, and review ideas) to hold it all together.
Washington H	Middle School Arts Integration Experience: Poetry and Art <i>Miss Emma Hartman; Bob Jones University, Greenville, SC</i> Mastering descriptive imagery can be a difficult task for many middle school students. Experience a lesson designed to unlock their creative potential as well as introduce symbolic imagery in art and poetry. A poetry writing activity finishes the session.
Jefferson A, G, P	Creation, the Fall, and Redemption: Foundational Concepts of a Biblical World View <i>Dr. Hubert Hartzler; Christian School Leadership Ministries, San Antonio, TX</i> The message of the entire Bible can be categorized under Creation, the Fall, and Redemption. We will examine the importance of these foundational concepts in the formation of a Biblical world view. Attention will be given to man’s rebellion against God and seven consequences, which affect life on Earth today.
Madison A, G, P	Is There Toxic Waste in Your School? <i>Dr. Brian Kosa; Heritage Christian School, Woodbridge, VA</i> There are so many things that happen on a daily basis in the school setting. This workshop will focus on practices that a teacher may do which create an atmosphere of toxicity. Rather than bringing a cleanup crew in, we will provide practical aspects for reducing toxicity in your school.

Monroe H	Ask the Hard Questions! <i>Dr. Jeff Walton; American Association of Christian Schools, Chattanooga, TN</i> Teachers often limit themselves to asking questions that require only lower-level thinking of students. This is especially true when writing tests and quizzes. Participants in this workshop will review Bloom’s Taxonomy of Learning and learn to ask oral questions and to write test questions that assess higher levels of learning. A useful tool called a Critical Thinking Wheel will be introduced.
