A 1 4, 8 * 30	Science Fairs: Trial or Triumph? <u>Dr. Brad Batdorf; Bob Jones University, Greenville, SC</u> Science Fairs provide great opportunities for students to develop scientific thinking by modeling the work of scientists, but science projects often fall short of their potential. Come learn what works, what doesn't, and be prepared to share some of your own struggles and successes.
A 2 8, 9, 10 * 30	The Flood <u>Mr. Skip Tilton; From Day One Ministries, Rock Hill, SC</u> The evidence for global catastrophe from the smallest rock to the largest landscape is overwhelming.
