
Mountain Region Competition Dress Code Notices



The dress code for ODACS athletic events is copied below. This information is copied directly from the ODACS athletic manual. Competitors who do not conform to the dress code will not be allowed to participate.

K. Dress Expectations

 Girls are required to wear knee-length culottes or loose fitting, knee-length sporting shorts for all sporting events. No pants may be worn. Pictures shown: culottes (left), sports shorts (right).



- 2. Boys may wear shorts for all sporting events.
- 3. Boys' hair should be short, off the collar and ears, one inch above the eyebrows, tapered in the back, combed, with no long sideburns. No beards or mustaches will be permitted for students.
- No tattoos or worldly body piercings may be visible during any ODACS sponsored sporting event.
- 5. No one may participate in bare feet. Track spikes are allowed and shoes for all sports shall meet National Federation standards.
- 6. The tournament director shall be responsible for seeing that all participants comply with the ODACS dress code for that activity. Should any participant be found to be not in compliance, the tournament director shall notify the coach, who shall make whatever modifications are possible at that event. Notification of violations shall be communicated to the pastor and school administrator in a letter from the executive director. Should a school be notified of infractions involving more than two athletes in two consecutive years, that school will be disqualified from participation in that tournament in the following year.
